Antique sculpture from Egypt, Rome and Greece, as well as more modern sculptures, such as the most important collection of Rodin works outside France. Paintings include David, Monet, Pissarro, Renoir, Degas, Cézanne, van Gogh, Toulouse-Lautrec and Bonnard.

The museum comprises three permanent collections whose nucleus dates back to the days of its founder, C. L. David: the Collection of Islamic Art, the Collection of European 18th-Century Art, and the Collection of Danish Early Modern Art. The unique Islamic collection enables the visitor to form a comprehensive impression of art from this cultural sphere.

World-famous Squatters' Commune: "Freetown" Christiania

A self-proclaimed autonomous area of about 850 residents, covering 84 acres. Christiania has been a source of controversy since its creation in a squatted military area in 1971. Its cannabis trade was tolerated by authorities until 2004. Since then, measures for normalizing the legal status of the community have led to conflicts, and negotiations are ongoing.
